1. Floating Cultures In River Deltas

Delta Lady focuses on River Deltas in Europe and their potential to develop innovative activities aiming at **utilization of ecosystem services**. The delta regions have rich biodiversity but lack financial resources. To boost the regional economy **Delta Lady** intends to **foster the capabilities** of using ecosystem services in deltas based on local natural and cultural qualities. Good practices from the past will be identified and case studies focused on the potential activities will be realized. **Delta Lady** aims at **improvement of the regional policy instruments** on **ecosystem services** to boost regional economy in river deltas.

4. Kick-off meeting & 1st Interregional Learning Event



On 1-2 October 2018, the Regional Natural Park of Camargue (FR) hosted the kick-off meeting and the 1st Interregional Learning Event of the **Delta Lady**. 22 participants met in Camargue to exchange experiences on the regional policies and good practices of the delta regions.

During the meeting partners discussed the issues and challenges in their deltas. There is no specific reference to the use of ecosystem services in their regional policies addressed in the project.

Meeting in the Natural Park of Camargue and the study tour to the delta was a success showcasing successful integration of biodiversity and tourism and other ecosystem services and opening the opportunities for the cross-regional learning.









All partners address policy instruments for valorisation of ecosystem services in the deltas for regional economy. Some start from the perspectives on tangible activities (e.g. Po, Danube, Rhone with fishing, reed, rice, tourism, education), whereas others address methods (distribution of benefits, effectuation, collaboration).

The director of the Natural Park of Camargue and stakeholders' group presented their views on the issues related to the rice farming, reed beds and fishery. Rice in Camargue is the main crop. Higher salinity of soil is a major issue. Balancing of the fishery yield which covers fish, shrimps and mussels is the major issue as well.

5. 1st Visit to the Delta

During the 1st learning event project partners visited Camargue delta, which is rich in biodiversity and ecosystem services. Cultivation of rice & reed beds, fisheries & salt production are important ecosystem services. Birds, bulls and wild horses are major for tourism. Tourism activities are diverse, from mass tourism on the seashore to cultural & natural tourism in the park area.







Partners visiting rice fields, bulls & horses & moving sea coast line; changing coastline is a major issue as well.







Camargue is home to wide range of wildlife, bulls and horses, and more than 400 species of birds. Other wildlife includes wild boars, badgers, flamingos, tree frogs (in the picture) and water snakes.



Famous Camargue white horses are ancient horse breeds. They are necessary to move and trek the herds of semi-wild bulls.



The famous pink flamingos of the Camargue's are symbols of the area. They are not hard to spot, but often they remain distant in the sea. Most easily flamingos are to be seen in the Camargue ornithological park.





6. Presenting the project to the Master students

The Lead Partner of the Delta Lady, University of Twente (CSTM), presented the project to the Master students of the Environmental and Energy Management programme (MEEM) on 13 September, 2018. The presentation was held in Fryslân, in the city of Leeuwarden. CSTM (Department of Governance & Technology for Sustainability) runs Environmental and Energy Management programme which is organized in the province of Fryslân. CSTM specialises in environmental policy & governance, sustainable development, environmental quality & resilience, social inclusiveness & technological innovation. Students expressed interest in the themes covered in the project, in particular ecosystem services, and related issues. The lead partner intends to involve the students in the project.

8. Regional Stakeholder Group (RSG) meeting in Italy

THE FIRST MEETING WITH THE LOCAL STAKEHOLDERS IN COMACCHIO





The RSG of Po Delta Park composed of local stakeholders met in Comacchio on 26 November, 2018. The focus of the first meeting was on tourism. About fifteen operators came to the salt pan of Comacchio to learn about the project and the concept of ecosystem services. The presentations of ERVET and the Po Delta Park Director followed the discussion on two main topics: the future perspectives/expectations of the tourism sector, and barriers to their achievements. Operators believe that there is a potential of increasing the number of tourists in the area, but a balance between nature preservation economic activities and must pursued. Operators identified some

elements that can improve the tourist experiences (i.e. bird watching towers); also some critical issues were identified such as lack of synergies between tour and hotel operators owners. possibility of collecting funds by taxing the tourists and investing this money in the preservation of ecosystems will be further explored and discussed. Starting from this common work with the local stakeholder of the RSG, the project will try to act on the existing barriers for enhancing and promoting the ecosystem services of the Po Delta Park.
